The Humanity of Jesus

Hi folks sad that we cannot meet right now, personally what I am finding is I am really more than ever pressing into God.

RECENTLY discovered a worship song that expressed my heart. The more I seek you, the more I find you, the more I LOVE YOU.

THAT REALLY is where I am at the moment... draw near to God and He will draw near to you... in a place of submission, intimacy and awe.

For many years God at different times has spoken to me about revival and how I will be involved. Without going into details, I have had many prophesies and more importantly God has given me verses about revival. Rev 2:4 where they are warned to return to their first love. Isa 4 first verse, the 7 women could be the churches of revelation, but I believe it's the church as a whole right now "let us be called by your name and take away our reproach".

I believe there will be a cry again in Scotland for JESUS. I believe the revival will be about the fire of God which is His LOVE, and God will touch and raise up people who love Him (not superstars).

Right now 2 Chronicles 7:14 &15 is what I feel I need to do (it's so obvious).

So where should our focus be?

All I am doing right now is studying the FATHER, SON and HOLY SPIRIT as individuals, although they never function independently, (where are the sermons on the trinity?).

Here are some thoughts on **The Humanity of Jesus** (it would be different preaching it)

In the garden of Gethsemane Perhaps here we see His humanity as He expresses distress both emotionally and physically at what He was about to face (sweating blood). He would have seen people crucified as it was a common punishment the Romans used. However it seems he knew His crucifixion would be even more horrendous. Perhaps He understood Isa 53 in a really deep way, to bear our sins, sickness, rejection etc., become a curse that we would be blessed. Yet He said not my will but yours. He chose to trust the Father who would enable Him to go through it all with the Helper, the Holy Spirit, and raise Him from the dead. His face alone was unrecognisable as a human (Isaiah 52)

A picture of us in our humanity where things seem so difficult and yet we can trust the Father. Jesus is our example.

John 12:27,28 Jesus was troubled and stressed about His coming crucifixion, so He's not suggesting we should be untouched emotionally by our troubles, but that God would be glorified, (glorify your own name) in the way we go through it with Him and the way it turns out...

Jesus also said my bread (what sustains me) is to do the will of the Father; being obedient sustained Him (the Helper, THE HOLY SPIRIT is essential in this situation and ours)

<u>IN PRAYER to the Father</u> In Hebrews 5:7 "who, in the days of His flesh, when He had offered up prayers and supplications with vehement cries and tears to Him who was able to save Him from death" (NKJV)

Jesus as an anointed man, took nothing for granted with cries and tears to His Father, is quite a wake up call to me. An amazing picture of a loving and obedient son crying out to His dad, help me Father, I need you Father.

John 11:41 In the previous verse Jesus said to Martha "did I not tell you and promise you, that if you would believe and rely on me, you would see the glory of God" (Amplified Bible). God's glory being not just the weight of His presence but a revelation of who He is, in this case resurrection and life. "Father I thank you you have heard me and you always listen and hear me".

A picture of the intimacy of the Father and Son as if it were a continual conversation, just as it it can and should be with us... God's thoughts to us are uncountable. He even puts a cry in our hearts of ABBA: ABBA, like JESUS WE ARE HIS SONS AND DAUGHTERS. We, as Jesus demonstrates can have a non stop conversation to the Father.

Jesus in his humanity, said I can do nothing of my own but the Father does His work through me...

- He was filled with joy by the Spirit—Luke 10:21
- He drove out demons by the Spirit—Matthew 12:28
- He taught by the Spirit—Acts 1:2
- He sacrificed himself by the Spirit—Hebrews 9:14.
- He healed by the Spirit, "the Holy Spirit was present to heal" Lk 5:17.
- He preached by the Spirit, "the Spirit of the Lord is upon me to preach good news to the poor" Isa 61, Lk 4:18 (NKJV)

The total reliance on the Holy Spirit is a lesson to us and a necessity to know...
