#### Action

- 1 **Opening Welcome & Worship** – Rev. Eileen Miller chaired the first meeting of the new session and read a passage from the Gospel of John chapter 1 v 1-14. She spoke about robots and how glad she was that we were not made in that image and how the Word had been made flesh and was a living thing which enabled us to work and grow together as individuals and churches. She also pointed out that there is now a Robot who conducts an orchestra and is appearing in Pisa but she wondered how this would work as there would be no emotion with such a device which gave us all food for thought.
  - 2 **Minutes of Previous Meeting (May)** – Following George Carratt's resignation as Chairman the position is open and nominations are welcomed.  
The minutes and Treasurers Report were passed as correct by Wilma Page and Ruth Anderson.
  - 3 **Matters Arising** - As suggested at the AGM in June, it was agreed that groups should be set up to deal with various projects and this was acted upon. 4 groups were set up as follows:
    - The God Question.** There will be a group dealing with the God Question. Alan Kimmitt, Ally Stark, Irene Ross, Anne Rennie, and Eileen Miller. This has still to be confirmed and Anne will speak to Ally Stark to confirm his willingness to call a meeting and to report back to the November meeting of Churches Together.
    - Oberammergau trip in 2020** A group dealing with the possibility of a trip to Oberammergau in 2020 which is being taken forward by David Smith. Information to be brought for discussion to the October/November meeting with a possible working group to follow.
    - Christian Unity Service.** Another evening Service of Unity will take place on Sunday 21 January. A small group will take the planning forward and Rev David Smith agreed to lead this group. Joy Allan, Mary McIndoe and Anne Rennie volunteered to be part of this group. It is hoped to have representatives of St Luke's and St Paul's and St Mary's and possibly a youth worker involved. A report is to be given at the November meeting.
    - Good Friday Walk of Witness.** A small group was proposed with Eileen Miller, Wilma Page, Anne Rennie, a representative from St Paul's and St Mary's and any other interested churches to look at the possibility of a Walk of Witness in Easter 2018.
- The Constitution Review** was discussed and it was decided to give extra time to this matter at one of our meetings when more representatives and clergy are present. If sufficient numbers are available, this would take place at the October meeting or failing that, at the November meeting.

A request was received from Amanda Hunter to speak at one of our meetings to highlight the needs of Dementia Patients in church surroundings and an invitation will be sent to her.
